

This is a short but emotionally charged season for Joburg Ballet, as we present *La Traviata-The Ballet*, a work already layered with complex emotional journeys for its characters. I have great respect and admiration for Veronica Paeper, the choreographer of this ballet adapted from the Verdi opera of the same name. The doyenne of South African ballet is now an octogenarian, though age has not slowed her as she still commands the rehearsal studio with the same vigour, attention to detail and technical eye for perfection that has defined her more than fifty years as a choreographer. Veronica has been assisted by Joburg Ballet's Ballet Mistress, Kim Vieira, and Rehearsal Coach, Thabang Mabaso in this staging of her production as it comes to Montecasino's Teatro for the first time.

This season is emotional for the Company as it marks the end of two momentous performing careers. Shannon Glover, longest serving Principal Dancer with Joburg Ballet, is retiring after a storied 20-year career. Shannon was promoted to Principal in 2011 and has performed many of the classical roles a dancer could dream of achieving in her career. She has inspired countless dancers over the decades with her precision and poise, building a fan base that will no doubt miss her on stage in the coming years. Shannon closes *La Traviata-The Ballet* with her final performance on Sunday 4 August at 15:00.

Nicole Ferreira-Dill was appointed Principal Dancer with Joburg Ballet in 2018 and has built a legacy at the company spanning 17 years. Nicole's statuesque presence and superb technical ability, showcased in many leading roles over the years, epitomise a principal dancer and inspired many young ballerinas. She leaves behind a career any ballet performer would be envious of achieving. Nicole's final bow will be on Saturday 3 August at 15:00.

This is a moment to celebrate the decades of dedication and excellence exhibited in Shannon and Nicole's careers. We look forward to finding new opportunities with them as they evolve in their careers. Change is the only constant we can rely on, offering us new doors of opportunity and we look forward to seeing those who will grow in the space provided as Joburg Ballet turns a new page.

From Veronica Paeper | Choreographer

Marie Duplessis, born Alphonsine Plessis, a Norman peasant, became one of the most notorious courtesans of Paris in the early 1840s. One of her lovers was the young Alexandre Dumas but the affair lasted only eleven months and on 3 February 1847 Marie died of consumption at the age of twenty-four.

On hearing of her death, Dumas wrote a novel fictionalizing their relationship, and in 1848 it was published. Because of its great success and because it was common to do so at the time, Dumas adapted the book into a play but owing to censorship the production was postponed and the premiere only took place on 3 February 1852, five years to the day after the death of Marie.

In this, the Romantic Age, literary and performing arts usually addressed the exotic and the supernatural: monsters in *Frankenstein* (1818), Sylphs in *La Sylphide* (1832), and Wilis in *Giselle* (1841) were the order of the day. *La Dame aux Camélias* was an extraordinary novel for its time, not only presenting a story of contemporary characters but having a courtesan as the heroine and treating her with compassion when the prostitute was seen as the ultimate fallen woman, spreading a "miasmatic mist of disease and corruption" in a society of strict moral standards.

Another aspect of the story which would have caught the imagination of Dumas' mid-19th century audience was the fact that the Romantics had a macabre fascination with sufferers of tuberculosis and to "wear a consumptive appearance" was extremely fashionable. Dumas' heroine suffered from this illness, so death was imminent and that, with the possible redemption of her sins by the sacrifice of her great love for the honour of her lover's family, made the story more socially acceptable and indeed extremely popular, as it has remained to this day.

Dumas renamed the heroine Marguerite Gautier in his literary works. In Verdi's *La Traviata* (1853) she became Violetta Valery and in the 1930s Greta Garbo immortalized her in the film *Camille* directed by George Cukor. Whichever name we use, the character of this courtesan continues to fascinate interpreters, directors, choreographers and audiences worldwide.

The Story

The action takes places in Paris and in Provence ACT I

Scene 1: The Germont household in Provence Armand takes leave of his family.

Scene 2: Madame Flora's Salon

The ladies of the house are entertaining their gentlemen visitors. Armand's friends, Pierre and Gaston, bring him to the house against his will. Camille returns from the opera with Baron Douphol. Armand and Camille meet and she gives him a camellia, inviting him to visit her when the flower has faded.

Scene 3: Camille's boudoir

INTERVAL

ACT II

A House in the Country

Camille and Armand are living happily together, but unbeknown to Armand, Camille is selling her jewellery to support them. Friends invite them to a picnic, but Camille is not well and remains at home. Armand's father, M. Germont, arrives and tells Camille that if she truly loves Armand she will leave him so as to maintain the honour and good name of the Germont family. In great distress she leaves the house in haste. She writes a letter to Armand and explains that as she must live with a man of means, she is leaving him. Unaware of his father's visit, Armand returns from the picnic and realizes that Camille has left him. His father tries to comfort him.

INTERVAL

ACT III

Scene 1: Madame Flora's Salon

A scene of jollity, mirth and gambling unfolds in the salon. Camille is back on the arm of Baron Douphol when Armand walks in and interrupts the party by insulting Camille.

Scene 2: Camille's boudoir, some months later

His father has told Armand the truth of Camille's leaving him, but it is too late as Camille is dying.

Camille en Armand woon gelukkig saam, maar onwetend aan Armand, verkoop Camille haar juwele om hulle te onderhou. Vriende nooi hulle na 'n piekniek, maar Camille voel olik en bly tuis. Armand se pa, M. Germont, arriveer en sê vir Camille dat, indien sy werklik lief is vir Armand, sy hom sal verlaat om sodoende die eer en goeie naam van die Germont-familie te behou. Paniekbevange verlaat sy spoedig die huis. Sy skryf 'n brief aan Armand en verduidelik dat, omdat sy 'n welgestelde man soek, sy hom verlaat. Onbewus van sy pa se besoek, keer Armand terug van die piekniek en besef dat Camille hom verlaat het. Sy pa probeer hom troos.

BEDRYF III Toneel 1: Madame Flora se Salon

'n Toneel van joligheid, vrolikheid en dobbelary ontvou in die salon. Camille is terug aan die arm van Baron Douphol wanneer Armand inloop en die partytjie onderbreek deur Camille te beledig.

Toneel 2: Camille se slaapkamer, enkele maande later

Armand se pa vertel hom die waarheid waarom Camille hom verlaat het, maar dit is egter te laat aangesien sy besig is om te sterf.


