Thanks to support from Institut Francais, we welcome danseur étoile from the Paris Opera Ballet, Guillaume Diop, on his first international guest appearance since ascending to this prestigious rank in 2023. Cuban-born Nelson Peña Nuñez returns to Joburg Ballet after twelve years, now as a principal dancer with the National Opera and Ballet Theatre of Kazakhstan. Japanese-born Ryoko Yagyu, a principal dancer with Ballet Ireland, also joins us for the season and remains with us until we perform *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* in October. None of these international guests would be possible without the longstanding partnership we have with Air France who continue to demonstrate their global support of the arts.

There are also a number of familiar faces guesting for this season, including Kitty Phetla as the elegantly evil Carabosse. Our thanks to South African ballet favourites Anya Carstens and Nigel Hannah who join the cast along with other guests listed in the programme. We are grateful to create a platform for younger and older ballet dancers to perform as we welcome the Joburg Ballet Academy, Carstens Ireland Ballet Studio and Johannesburg Youth Ballet.

The Sleeping Beauty

PROLOGUE The Christening

King Florestan XXIII and his Queen have invited all the fairies to be present as godmothers at the christening of their infant daughter, Princess Aurora. Cattalabutte, the Master of Ceremonies, has omitted to invite the wicked fairy Carabosse who arrives late, insulted and enraged. As her christening gift she vows that one day the princess will prick her finger on the point of a spindle and die. Happily, however, the Lilac Fairy has still to bestow her gift and confounds Carabosse with the promise that Aurora will not die but, instead, fall into a deep sleep from which she will be awakened by a Prince's kiss.

ACT I The Spell

In the garden of the royal palace courtiers have assembled to celebrate Princess Aurora's sixteenth birthday. Four princes have come to seek the hand of Aurora in marriage. In the midst of the festivities an old nurse gives her a posy of flowers in which is hidden a spindle. As the princess pricks her finger the old woman reveals herself as the wicked Carabosse and vanishes. The Lilac Fairy enters to fulfil her promise, casting a spell of sleep over the whole scene. She conjures up a thick forest which conceals the palace.

INTERVAL

ACT II The Vision

A hundred years have passed. The young Prince Désiré is on a hunting expedition in the forest. His courtiers follow the hunt while he remains alone, dreaming of a different life.

The Lilac Fairy appears and shows the prince a vision of Aurora. Enchanted, they dance. The vision disappears and the prince implores the Lilac Fairy to take him to the Sleeping Beauty. She guides him through the forest to the hidden palace where Princess Aurora lies asleep. On his way, the prince encounters a furious Carabosse. They fight but just as Prince Désiré appears to be vanquished, the Lilac Fairy intercedes and saves him. She reveals Aurora to him and the prince awakens her with a kiss. They fall in love and the Lilac Fairy blesses their engagement.

ACT III The Wedding

Fairy-tale characters dance at the wedding celebrations of Princess Aurora and Prince Désiré, with courtiers joining in for the final mazurka and joyful apotheosis.

Die Slapende Skoonheid

PROLOOG Die Doop

Koning Florestan XXIII en sy Koningin nooi al die feë om as peetmoeders teenwoordig te wees by die doop van hulle babadogtertjie, Prinses Aurora. Die Seremoniemeester, Cattalabutte, het egter nagelaat om die aaklige fee, Carabosse, te nooi. Carabosse arriveer laat, voel beledig en is woedend. As doopgeskenk is Carabosse se wens dat Prinses Aurora eendag haar vinger aan 'n spinwiel sal prik en sterf. Die Lila Fee moet egter nog haar wens uitspreek en maak Carabosse se wens ongedaan met die belofte dat Prinses Aurora nie sal sterf nie, maar eerder in 'n diep slaap sal verval, waaruit 'n Prins se kus haar sal ontwaak.

BEDRYF I Die Betowering

In die tuin van die koninklike paleis het die howelinge byeengekom om Prinses Aurora se sestiende verjaarsdag te vier. Vier prinse daag op en vra Prinses Aurora om haar hand. Midde in die feesvieringe gee 'n ou verpleegster vir Prinses Aurora 'n ruiker blomme waarin 'n naald versteek is. Tydens die prik van haar vinger onthul die ou verpleegster haarself aan Prinses Aurora as die aaklige Carabosse en verdwyn. Die Lila Fee daag op om haar belofte na te kom en omtower die toneel in 'n slaap. Sy skep 'n digte woud waarin die paleis versteek word.

BEDRYF II Die Droombeeld

'n Honderd jaar verloop. Die jong Prins Désiré is op 'n jagekspedisie in die woud. Sy howelinge is aan die jag terwyl Prins Désiré alleen verkeer en van 'n ander lewe droom.

Die Lila Fee verskyn en wys vir die prins 'n visioen van Aurora. In betowering is hulle besig om te dans. Die droombeeld verdwyn en Prins Désiré smeek die Lila Fee om hom na die Slapende Skoonheid te neem. Sy lei hom deur die woud na die versteekte paleis waar die slapende Prinses Aurora haar bevind. Op pad daarheen loop Prins Désiré 'n woedende Carabosse raak. Hulle begin baklei en net toe dit lyk asof Prins Désiré die geveg gaan verloor, tree die Lila Fee tussenbeide en red hom. Sy onthul Prinses Aurora aan hom en hy ontwaak haar met 'n kus. Hulle raak verlief en die Lila Fee seën hulle verlowing.

BEDRYF III Die Troue

Sprokiesagtige karakters dans by die bruiloffees van Prinses Aurora en Prins Désiré met die howelinge wat deelneem aan die finale mazurka en vreugdevolle verheerliking.

PROLOGUE Ubhabhadiso

Inkosi uFlorestan XXIII kanye neNdlovukazi yakhe bameme wonke ama-fairies ukuthi abekhona njengonkulunkulukazi ekubhabhathisweni kwendodakazi yabo ewusana, uPrincess Aurora. u Cattalabutte, Umphathi Wemicimbi, uyekile ukumema inganekwane embi uCarabosse ofika sekwephuzile, ethukwa futhi ethukuthele. Njengesipho sakhe sokubhabhathiswa uyafunga ukuthi ngelinye ilanga inkosazana iyozihlaba umunwe ngothi lokuphotha futhi ife. Nokho, ngokujabulisayo, i-Lilac Fairy kusafanele inikeze isipho sayo futhi idide uCarabosse ngesithembiso sokuthi u-Aurora ngeke afe kodwa, esikhundleni salokho, alale ubuthongo obunzima lapho ezovuswa khona ngokuqabula kweNkosana.

ACT I Umlingo

Engadini yesigodlo izikhulu zihlangene ukuze zigubhe usuku lokuzalwa lukaPrincess Aurora lweshumi nesithupha. Izikhulu ezine zize zizofuna isandla sika-Aurora emshadweni. Phakathi nemikhosi umhlengikazi osekhulile umnika iphoyizi lezimbali lapho kufihlwe khona intonga yokuphotha. Njengoba inkosazana ihlaba umunwe isalukazi siziveza njengeCarabosse ekhohlakele futhi sinyamalale. I-Lilac Fairy ingena ukuze igcwalise isithembiso sayo, yenza isipelingi sokulala phezu kwendawo yonke. Uvusa ihlathi eliwugqinsi elisithe isigodlo.

INTERVAL

ACT II Umbono

Sekudlule iminyaka eyikhulu. UPrince Désiré osemncane usohambweni lokuzingela ehlathini. Izikhulu zakhe zilandela ukuzingela ngenkathi esala yedwa, ephupha ngempilo ehlukile. I-Lilac Fairy ivela futhi ikhombisa inkosana umbono we-Aurora. Bajabulile, bayadansa. Umbono uyanyamalala futhi inkosana inxusa i-Lilac Fairy ukuthi imyise Ebuhleni Bobuthongo. Uyamqondisa ehlathini, aye esigodlweni esicashile lapho uPrincess Aurora elele khona. Endleleni, inkosana ihlangana neCarabosse ethukuthele. Bayalwa kodwa njengoba nje uPrince Désiré ebonakala enqotshiwe, i-Lilac Fairy iyamlamulela futhi imsindise. Wembula u-Aurora kuye futhi inkosana imvusa ngokumanga. Bathandana futhi i-Lilac Fairy ibusisa ukuhlanganyela kwabo.

ACT III Umshado

Abalingiswa bezinganekwane bayadansa emikhosini yomshado ka-Princess Aurora kanye no-Prince Désiré, kanye nezikhonzi ezihlanganyela ku-mazurka yokugcina kanye ne-apotheosis ejabulisayo.

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

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Guest Artists

Guillaume Diop

Guillaume Diop was born in Paris in 2000 and started dancing at the age of four. He joined the Paris Opera Dance School in 2012 and the Paris Opera Ballet in 2018.

A man of convictions and determined to evolve his discipline towards greater openness, Guillaume Diop co-wrote in 2020 a manifesto that opened a conversation on the lack of diversity, inclusion and representation at the Paris Opera.

In 2021, he was awarded the Carpeaux Dance Prize and Arop Dance Prize, awards annually given by the patron circles of the Paris Opera to the most promising young artists of the company. In 2023, in Seoul, while performing the role of Albrecht in Giselle during a company tour to Korea, he was appointed to the rank of Étoile.

Acclaimed by audiences and drawing the attention of the media in France and worldwide, Guillaume Diop has become one the most prominent public figures in France. He has earned several distinctions such as GQ France Men of the Year (2023), ADAMI's Artist of the Year (2023) and was included in Forbes Africa (2023) and Forbes France (2024) 30 under 30 rankings.

Guillaume Diop's repertoire at the Paris Opera Ballet includes leading roles in Rudolf Nureyev's Romeo and Juliet, Don Quixote, La Bayadère, Swan Lake and The Nutcracker, Harald Lander's Études, John Neumeier's Vaslaw, Jean Coralli and Jules Perrot's Giselle, Maurice Béjart's Songs of a Wayfarer, Wayne McGregor's The Dante Project, Kenneth MacMillan's Manon, Jerome Robbins' In the Night and Frederick Ashton's La Fille mal gardée.

Guillaume Diop makes his debut as the Prince in Joburg Ballet's *The Sleeping Beauty* which also marks his first guest engagement outside the Paris Opera Ballet since his elevation to Étoile.

Nelson Peña Nuñez

Nelson Peña Nuñez was born in Cuba and trained at the Cuban National Ballet School in Havana where he graduated in 2009.

Soon afterwards he was invited to South Africa where he danced with Mzansi Productions and subsequently with South African Mzansi Ballet where he had the opportunity to perform leading and soloist roles in *Giselle*, *The Nutcracker* and *Le Corsaire*.

In 2013 he joined the National Opera and Ballet Theatre of Kazakhstan. He was elevated to principal dancer status in 2021.

Other companies Nelson Peña Nuñez has appeared with include the Russian National Ballet, Astana Ballet and Saint Petersburg Classical Ballet. He has danced extensively in Europe, England, Canada, Russia and the United States.

His repertoire includes leading roles in Swan Lake, Cinderella, Spartacus, Don Quixote, Carmen Suite, Les Sylphides, Scheherazade, Romeo and Juliet, Legend of Love, Red Giselle, Bolero and Carmina Burana.

He danced the Prince in *The Sleeping Beauty* for the first time earlier in 2024 and repeats this role in his guest engagement with Joburg Ballet in June and July 2024.

Ryoko Yagyu

Ryoko Yagyu was born in Japan. She began dancing at the age of three and completed her training at the Viennese Conservatory in Austria. During her training, she was invited to perform at the International Festival of World Ballet Stars in the Ukraine.

Performances with other companies include principal roles in *La Sylphide*, *The Sleeping Beauty* and *Swan Lake* with Vienna Festival Ballet. She has made guest appearances in principal roles with the Irish National Youth Ballet and Pasodos Dance Company in Mallorca. She has also worked with New English Ballet Theatre, London, performing a mixed repertoire of new works, and with Peter Schaufuss Ballet where she performed soloist roles in Frederick Ashton's *Romeo and Juliet*. She has also performed as a guest artist with the Ballet Festival of Indonesia.

Her competition credits include the Kobe Dance Junior and Senior Competitions, the Prix de Lausanne and the Premio Roma.

Ryoko Yagyu is a principal dancer with Ballet Ireland where she has performed in Romeo and Juliet, The Nutcracker, Swan Lake, Die Fledermaus, Giselle and Bold Moves.

Ryoko Yagyu is spending six months with Joburg Ballet through to mid-October 2024.

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


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































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
